I wanted to give you some background information on Dr. Leonard S. Gottlieb's recent trip to Israel. As you may recall, Dr. Gottlieb and a group from Boston University School of Medicine's (BUSM) Department of Pathology and Laboratory Medicine and Mallory Institute of Pathology attended the 2nd International Conference on Gastrointestinal Cancer held in Jerusalem, from August 27 to September 1, 1989.

Gottlieb, a professor and chairman of the Department of Pathology and Laboratory Medicine at BUSM, and his associates co-authored and presented several papers covering recent advances in epidemiology, diagnostic modalities, screening and therapy. In addition, Gottlieb and Michael O'Brien, M.D., a professor of pathology and laboratory medicine at BUSM, co-chaired a session on colorectal adenoma sponsored by the World Health Organization, (WHO).

Gottlieb, who is also Director of the Louis and Charlotte Kaitz BUSM/Hebrew University-Hadassah Medical School Faculty/Student Exchange Program, met with the dean of the Hadash Medical School and with Dr. Alan Rubinow, director of the Exchange Programs at the medical school during his trip.

Dr. Gottlieb would be happy to discuss with you the significance of his trip. He noted that it was particularly interesting because he had the opportunity to teach his non-Jewish colleagues more about the past and present history of the Jewish people.
