Back Bay resident L. Patricia Barrett, M.D., an assistant professor of radiology at Boston University School of Medicine, recently was appointed a member of the Admissions Committee for the 1982-83 cycle by Dean John I. Sandson, M.D.

The 15-member committee is made up of representatives of each discipline of medicine and works with the Office of Admissions in all facets of the admissions process. The committee screens applications for admission to the School and makes the final judgment on each candidate. John F. O'Connor, M.D., associate dean for admissions, is chairman of the Admissions Committee.

Barrett received her bachelor's degree from Mount Holyoke College in 1968 where she graduated cum laude. She received her M.D. degree from BUSM in 1972 and joined the BUSM faculty in 1978 after completing her residency.

She is a member of such professional organizations as the American College of Radiology and the Massachusetts Radiological Society and is the author or co-author of several articles published in scientific journals.
