Stuart Strong, M.D., professor and chairman of the Otolaryngological Department at Boston University School of Medicine, was recently elected president of the American Laryngological Association. Strong is also Chief of Otolaryngology at University Hospital in Boston, a teaching hospital of BUSM.

Born and educated in Dublin, Ireland, Strong has been a professor of otolaryngology at the School since 1956.
