MEDICAL SCHOOL GIFT--West Yarmouth resident Mrs. Irving Krute, second left, president of Aid for Cancer Research, recently visited Boston University School of Medicine as her organization presented the School with a Gamma Scintillation Counter. Michael Bennett, M.D., right, a professor of pathology and microbiology, accepted the machine on behalf of the School of Medicine. Among others attending the presentation were Aid for Cancer Research members Mrs. Phyllis Frank, left, and Mrs. Norman Weinberg, second right. The machine detects gamma ray emission and the killing of tumor cells by lymphocytes, a type of white blood cell. Aid for Cancer Research is a group of 27 women from the Greater Boston area which raises funds to advance cancer research. The organization donated \$9,600 toward the purchase of the machine.
