ADJUDICATORS

HERB POMEROY has been teaching at Berklee College of Music since 1955 and at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology from 1963-1985. A leader in jazz education, Herb has performed with Lionel Hampton's Band, the Kenton Band and the Charlie Parker Quintet. He has represented American jazz on State Department tours throughout Europe and abroad. Mr. Pomeroy directs his own big band, which continues to represent the highest levels of jazz performance.

DAVE BARGERON, of Blood, Sweat and Tears, currently plays with the Bob Mintzer Big Band in New York City.
