NEWTON RESIDENT INDUCTED INTO ALPHA OMEGA ALPHA NATIONAL HONOR MEDICAL SOCIETY

Boston, Mass.--David E. Burdette, M.D., of Newton, Mass., was recently inducted into the Boston University Chapter of the Alpha Omega Alpha (AOA) Honor Medical Society. Burdette is a teaching fellow in clinical neurology and the chief resident of neurology at Boston University Affiliated Hospitals Neurology Training Program.

Burdette received his medical degree from Boston University School of Medicine (BUSM) where he was awarded the Sandoz Prize in Clinical Neurology. He performed his internship at St. Joseph Mercy Hospital in Ann Arbor, Michigan.

AOA is the only national honor medical society in the world. It was organized for the promotion of scholarship and research in medical schools, the encouragement of a high standard of character and conduct among medical students and graduates, and the recognition of high attainment in medical science, practice and related fields.
