## THE BOSTON UNIVERSITY ALUMNI CONCERT BAND

The Boston University Alumni Concert Band was conceived by Daniel J. Finn and organized by Lee Chrisman. This organization has brought together alumni of the School of Music (formerly the College of Music) who graduated in the past thirty (or more) years and continue to be actively engaged in music. Since 1978, performances have been presented several times each year for University functions and in public concerts in Greater Boston. The band performs annually at the Alumni Reunion and Commencement. Membership is voluntary and alumni come from many locations to participate in the band's programs. Lee Chrisman has served as conductor since the inception of the Alumni Concert Band.

The band, comprising of fifty players, made its first European tour in the summer of 1985. The fifteen-day tour of Portugal included seven concerts presented in Lisbon, Caldas do Rainha, Figueira da Foz, Pova de Varzim, Porto, Viana do Castelo, and Olivias. Major Idilio Fernandes, Conductor of da Banda Guarda Nacional Republicana, was the guest conductor of the band's concert in Lisbon.

The second European tour was made in the summer of 1988 to Yugoslavia. Concerts were presented as part of the annual music festivals in Dubrovnik, Split, and Opatija. Additional concerts were performed in Sarajevo, Bled, and Zagreb. Both tours were enthusiastically received by large, appreciative audiences. Numerous presentations were made to Dr. Chrisman and the band by officials of the cities where concerts were presented. Personnel for the Yugoslavia tour included players from fifteen states – from Maine to Florida, and Massachusetts to California.

The concert tours of the band have been partially subsidized by the University and contributions from alumni. It is hoped that this group of talented performers may continue to serve as musical ambassadors in representing the alumni and the University.

More than fifty performances have been presented since the band was organized. Some of the concert sites have included the Museum of Our National Heritage in Lexington, the Boston Public Library, the Merrimack Pavilion in Lowell, the Boston Naval Shipyard, and various locations on campus.

During the past several years, programs have been performed in conjunction with the Alumni Awards ceremony, the Howard Thurman fall convocation, the Fourth of July celebration in Lowell, and the turnaround of the U.S.S. *Constitution*. The versatility of the band has provided opportunities for performances to be presented in concert halls, cathedrals, parks, casinos, outdoor theatres, and village squares. There continues to be a remarkable *esprit de corps* within the Alumni Concert Band, which results from a common bond to the University and the making of music together.
