Belmont resident J. David Ogilby, a fourth-year medical student at Boston University School of Medicine, has been named one of five finalists in the Young Investigator's Award Competition of the Annual Scientific Meeting of the American College of Cardiology, to be held March 11 to 14 in Miami Beach.

Ogilby's winning paper, entitled "Effect of Retrograde Systolic Stretch on Ischemic Myocardium," resulted from work done during a fourth-year research elective at the School of Medicine under the direction of Carl S. Apstein, M.D., an associate professor of medicine.

The A.C.C.Y.I.A. competition is open to researchers from the level of fourth-year medical students to assistant professors under 35 years of age.

Ogilby was graduated from Harvard College in 1974 and is currently pursuing a fourth-year elective in rural family medicine at the Gorham Medical Center in Gorham, N.H.

Ogilby lives on Washington Street in Belmont.
