SELWYN A. BROITMAN, Ph.D., LECTURES ON
"CONTROVERSIES IN NUTRITION AND CANCER"

(Boston, Mass.)--Newton Highlands resident Selwyn A. Broitman, Ph.D., a professor of pathology and microbiology at Boston University School of Medicine (BUSM), recently spoke on "Controversies in Nutrition and Cancer" as part of a lecture series sponsored by the Boston Cancer Research Association, a group of basic and clinical researchers from the Boston scientific community.

Broitman, assistant dean of admissions at BUSM, discussed the relationship of high fat diets and cholesterol to cancer of the large bowel.

A graduate of Michigan State, Broitman belongs to the American Institute of Nutrition and is a founding member of the Digestive Disease Foundation.

The lecture took place at the Countway Library of Medicine in Boston.

BUSM is the site of several interdisciplinary research centers, including the Hubert H. Humphrey Cancer Research Center and the Cardiovascular Institute of Boston University. The School is an innovator in medical education, offering several alternative curricula leading to the M.D. degree.
