Voter registration set for June 6, 7

Register at UH to vote in this fall's elections

The University Hospital this week becomes the first hospital in Massachusetts ever to conduct voter-registration sessions. The pilot drive—sponsored by the Hospital's Affirmative Action Advisory Group—is part of a major campaign by the Massachusetts Hospital Association to register as many Massachusetts citizens as possible before the primary election on Tuesday, Sept. 18.

A new law signed last November makes it possible for Massachusetts citizens to register to vote at any voter-registration session, or with any city or town clerk, board of registrars of voters, or election commission. Formerly, residents could register to vote only in the city or town in which they lived.

The times and locations for the UH sessions—which are open to the public, as well as to Medical Center staff and employees—are as follows:

- **Wednesday, June 6:** noon to 2 p.m., at the entrance to the SkyLight Dining Pavilion, and 4 p.m. to 6 p.m., in the Atrium Lobby.
- **Thursday, June 7:** 7:30 a.m. to 9:30 a.m., and 2:30 p.m. to 4:30 p.m., at the top of the Atrium 2 escalators.



Your vote is crucial since it involves the election of officials who will help shape the future of health care in Massachusetts. So take the first step and register to vote—no special identification is needed and it only takes two to three minutes.
