## Dr. King, Black Achievers program coming up Jan. 18 in Keefer Auditorium

Members of the Medical Center community are invited to attend a Friday, Jan. 18 program entitled "Affirmative Action: Past, Present and Future," which will honor the memory of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., and the Medical Center's 1991 Black Achievers. The ceremony will begin at noon in Keefer Auditorium.

Jane C. Edmonds, president of Jane C. Edmonds & Associates and the former Affirmative Action Officer for the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, will be the keynote speaker. Opening remarks will be made by Jacqueline A. Dart, executive vice president for Operations at the University Hospital, Aram V. Chobanian, M.D., dean of Boston University School of Medicine, and Spencer N. Frankl, D.D.S., M.S.D., dean of the Goldman School of Graduate Dentistry. Musical selections will be performed by the BUMC Choir. Light refreshments will be served and a drawing will be held for a doorprize.

Edmonds' remarks will be followed by a special ceremony honoring 15 Medical Center employees, who have been selected to participate in the Greater Boston YMCA Black Achievers Program. The 15-year-old program is aimed at recognizing the accomplishments of black employees and fostering the development of minority youth by building relationships with these positive role models.
