WORLD'S ONLY DOUBLE VIRGINAL HARPSICHORDIST HOLDS BENEFIT FOR UH

On November 20, the world's only double virginal harpsichordist, James Nicolson, will perform a selection of High Renaissance pieces from Spain, Italy and England at a concert to benefit the University Hospital (UH), where just one year ago he underwent spinal surgery that saved his career. The evening will begin with a reception at 6 p.m. followed by the concert from 7 p.m. to 8 p.m. at Boston University Castle at 222 Bay State Road in Boston.

Nicolson, who recently returned from a concert tour of Europe, is a member of the New England Conservatory of Music's Collegium Musicum, a fellow at the Berkshire Music Center at Tanglewood and on the faculty of the Longy School of Music in Cambridge. A double virginal harpsichord, which is rare today, was extremely popular in Europe until 1650.
